Thank you for your quick reply. You are properly concerned about the phase-in period.

I will seek final Science approval this month and then send to CCC. No relevant catalog changes have been submitted at this point.

If approved, we will need to have a phase-in period. First, it will have almost no immediate effect on the incoming Bio majors, because it only affects sophomore & above classes. I suspect that the wise choice will be to convert the 200-level classes in 2014-2015, 300-level the following year, etc
